PUBLIC PROCUREMENT – VALUE CREATION BY POLICY & PRACTICES FOR DEVELOPED INDIA

As India marches towards its goal of a USD30 to 35 trillion economy by 2047, and significant achievements in sustainable development goals, government procurement will continue to be one of the critical contributors to overall economic growth. The initiatives and policy-making by the GoI signals creation of an ecosystem that not only incentivises supply-side domestic capacity building (through the “Make in India”, development of SMEs and Start-ups, defence cluster and the PLI Scheme) but also endeavours to create a demand-based market for the products and services offered by Indian businesses. Public Procurement, therefore, is becoming more user friendly and complex with focus on areas of value creation with emphasis on technology transfers, procurement of high end technological products, sustainable development goals, rapidly changing requirement for procurement professionals capacity, use of modern technologies and tools like AI, BlockChain, Big Data etc., important changes in GeM (New Rate Contract system, use of AI in Incident Management etc) and other portals but a lot more effort and change management is needed for future public procurement for developed India.

There is need for contracts being designed with the allocation of risks that are balanced between the various stakeholders, including the government, and present a sense of understanding of investor sentiments, sectoral risks and commerciality, which are shortcomings that government contracts have otherwise been criticised for. With the recent developments in the procurement framework and the larger regulatory framework for businesses along with the tremendous increase in economic activities, advancements in technology and business tools, government procurement presents immense opportunities for stakeholders across sectors to participate in public procurements and contribute to the India growth story. Effort will have to continue on leveraging public procurement for social welfare & inclusive economic growth, environment protection, ethical and transparent business operations, procurement capacity building and comprehensive unified law.
